Being a Geographer

To begin to explore maps, understanding some core ideas that they then produce in their own sketch maps:

- Maps are from a bird'seye view. The same perspective as an aerial photograph.
- A 2d representation of things that are really 3d.
- Objects on a map are much smaller than they are in real life.
- Symbols and a key are used to show things on a map so that the map doesn't become too crowded. The same symbols are used for the same type of object on a map.

Children should recognise digital imagery as an effective tool in recording and using geographical information.
