Literacy

Key Text: 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell

Purpose for writing: For 'Owl Babies' we will be adapting the story and writing an opening to a story with our own ideas. Our story openers will focus on describing the characters and the setting. We will be working on our non-negotiables, re-reading our sentences to check they make sense and adding any extra words to make our sentences stronger.

Key words and skills: Using plurals and the suffix s/es. Using adjectives to describe and set a scene.

Geography: Local study of Oundle

Children should know the name of our town (Oundle) and that our school is here. They should know where their home is. Where relevant, they should know the

name of the nearest big centre (e.g. Peterborough).

We will have visitors to teach us map skills and more about our local area.

Focus: Drawing and Collage

The children will be focussing Pop Art and on the artist Andy Warhol. They will look at the different colours used and create a collage using different materials.
