

What we already know:

- We have discussed and looked at evergreen and deciduous leaves and trees in our plants topic in the Autumn term.
- Over the year we have been looking at seasonal changes where we identify and discuss the changes we can see happening to the trees, plants and flowers around us.



What's next? Everyday materials:

We will be revisiting our topic of materials and looking at materials in everyday objects. What are they made from? What do they feel like? We will learn how to identify and classify materials into 'manmade' and 'natural' materials.

Trees

We will be looking at whether the trees are evergreen or deciduous trees and what features they display to help us identify them.

- I know that deciduous trees drop their leaves in Autumn and they grow them back in Spring.
- I know that evergreen trees keep their leaves all year round.
- I know that evergreen trees stay the same colour all year round.

I know what the roots, trunk, branches, twigs, leaves, needles and buds of the tree are and that they are for.









