Prior Learning

Children should be familiar with how to dye pieces of cloth using natural and man-made dyes.

They should also know that by wrapping sections of cloth with string or elastic bands, before dyeing, will cause those areas to stay white and not absorb the dye.

Key Information

During this topic, children will study different designs and designers and explore different techniques for creating prints and patterns. They will learn what textile art is and how some artists convey stories through their textile works. Children will be able to practice mark making, techniques to repel ink/paint, use different mediums to print and discover the batik technique.
