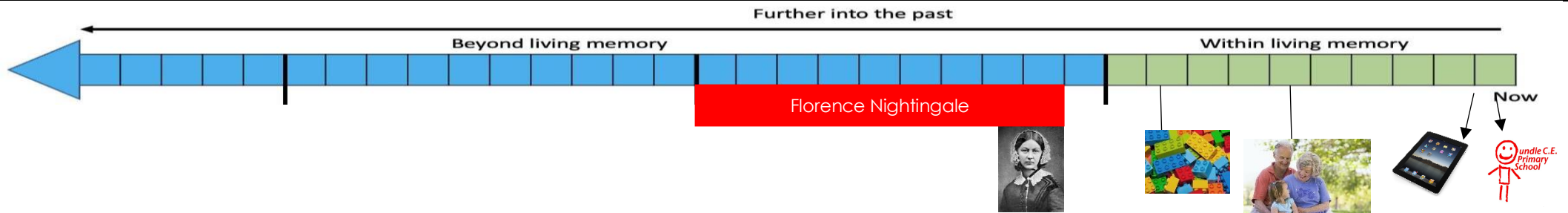
- That nurses are people who help us
